It is an umbrella verification scheme that recognizes any green products and services with existing green certifications and gathers them under a single, recognisable Mark. This session will brief in details on the background, requirement of the registration together with the benefits of the registration. It is aimed at being the definitive guide for government and corporate green procurement. 10.45 ~ 11.30 am	<p><b>Topic 2:</b> Green Technology Tax Incentive (Green Investment Tax Allowances (GITA) and Green Income Tax Exemption (GITE)</p> <p><b>Abstract:</b> <i>Green Technology Tax Incentive for purchase and use of green technology were announced by the Prime Minister of Malaysia on 25 October 2013 during the Budget 2014.</i></p> <p><i>The purpose of this incentive is to strengthen the development of green technology through green investment tax allowances (GITA) for the purchase of Green Technology Asset or Project and green income tax exemption (GITE) for Green Technology service providers.</i></p> <p><i>Throughout the period, some of the improvements to the existing incentive has been done i.e. additional list of assets under GITA Asset as well as current announcement on extension of Green Incentives until 31 December 2023.</i></p> <p><i>We hope that this incentive will further boost the Malaysian green economy and to attain the nation's goal to generate 20% of energy consumption from renewable sources by 2025.
